


In 1517, Martin Luther published 95 Theses a text that criticized acts of the Pope and protested some practices of some churches	Holy Book - Bible <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Made up of 66 books (chapters) • Divided into Old and New Testaments • Old Testament: Describes history, laws, details of prophets, and the Messiah • New Testament: Written after Jesus's death, these provide life and death of Jesus • New Testament is made up of letters that offer instruction to churches 	History <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First church came 50 days after Jesus's death - church was in Jerusalem • Jesus was born in Bethlehem between 2 B.C. and 7 B.C. to Virgin Mary • Born Jewish - aimed to reform it, but created a new religion instead • Jesus traveled with 12 apostles • Early Christians were persecuted by Romans until Emperor Constantine came along and converted to Christianity himself 	Jesus and his family fled to Egypt after King Herod almost persecuted them.
	After the Crusades, the Churches wealth and power increased, even though they didn't take Jerusalem.
